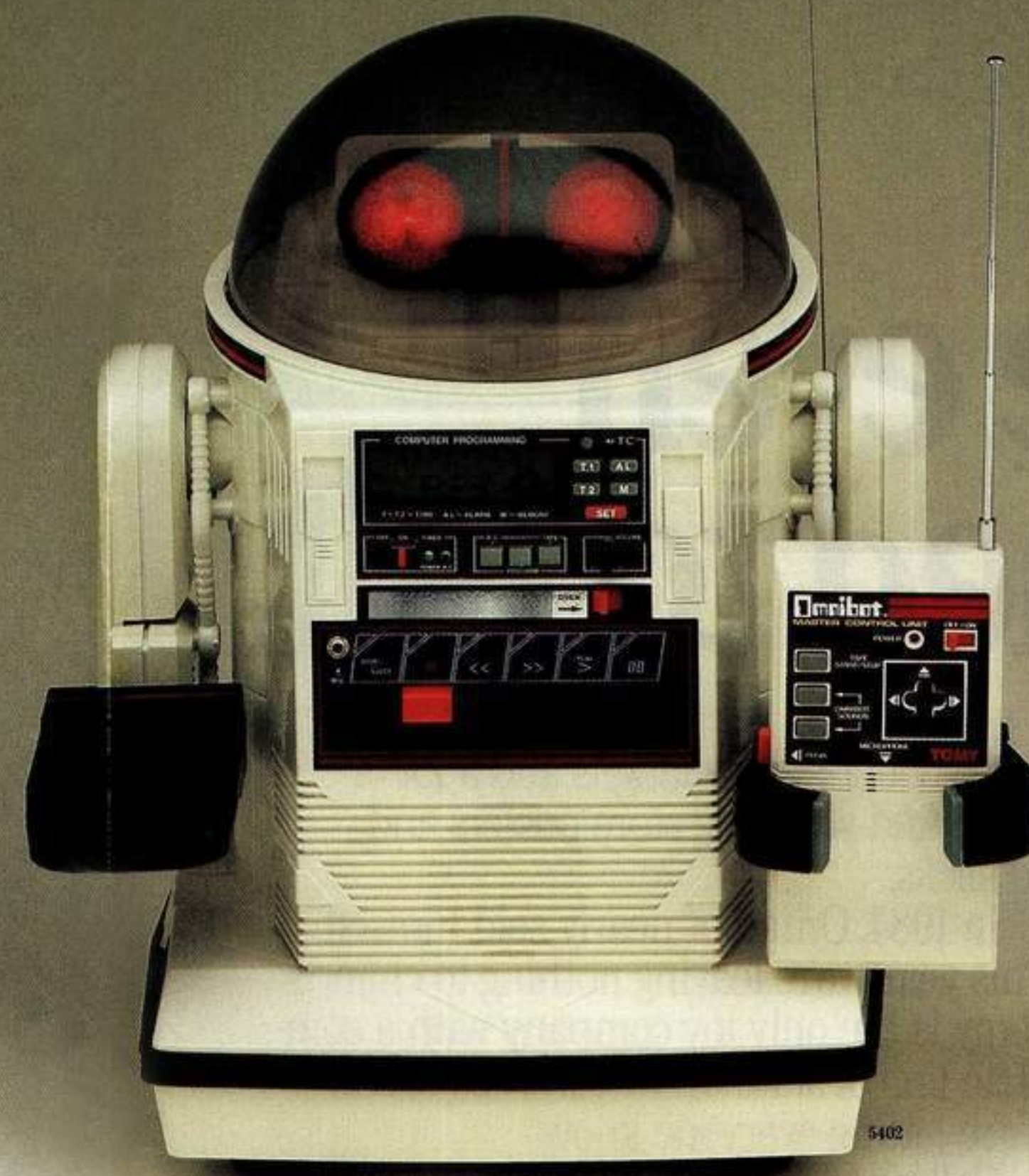
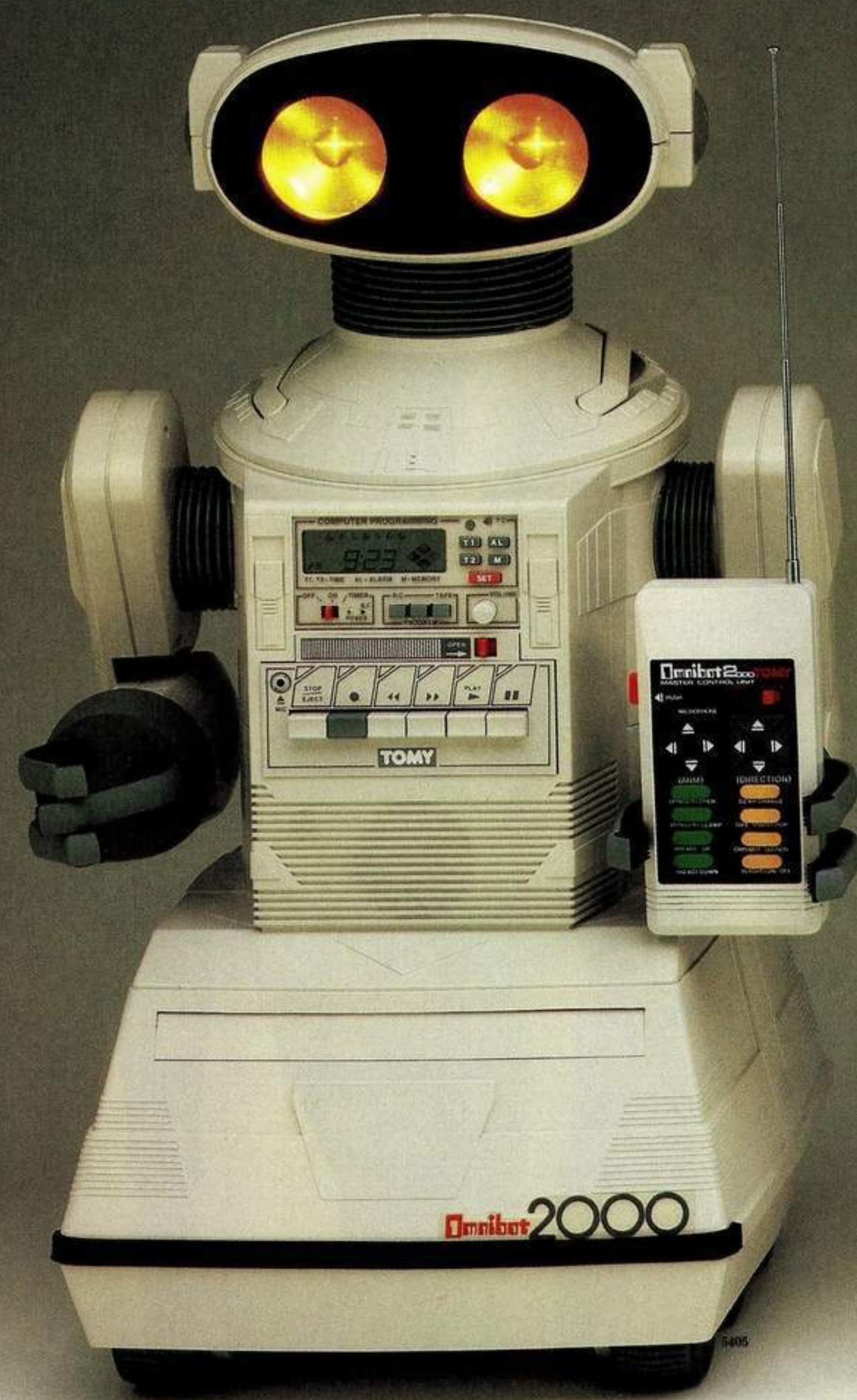

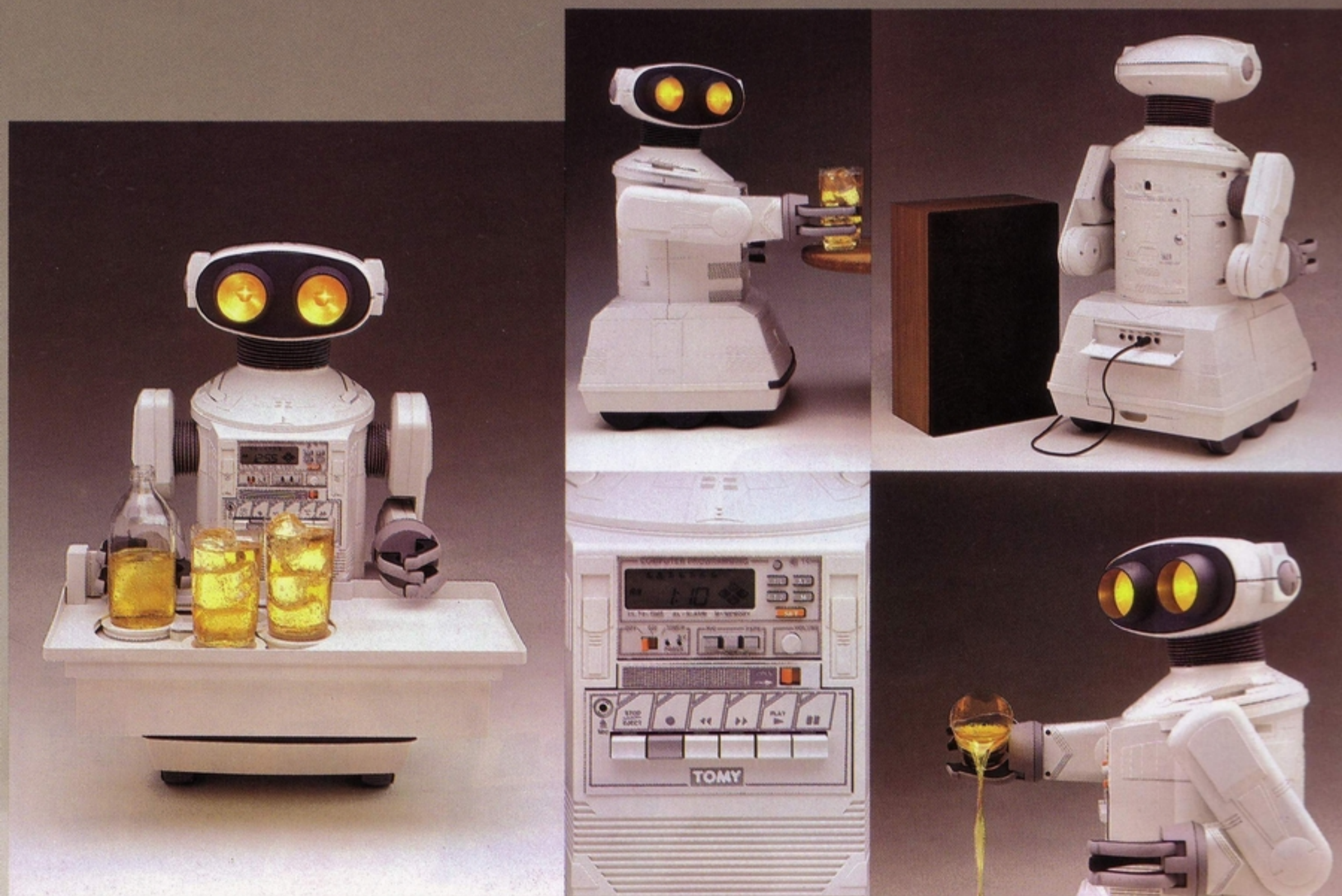
Hootbot™ This endearing creature is happy to sit on his perch (included) with eyes flashing, wings flapping and feet tapping. Set him down and he waddles away.
